Bosnia and Herzegovina

Born on 1936 in Oštrelj (Bosnia and Herzegovina). He has been graduated at Medical Faculty (University of Sarajevo, 1960), and completed specialization in neuropsychiatry in 1966 as well as post-graduation studies in Experimental Medicine (M.Sc., 1969), and in Clinical Psychopharmacology (Medical Faculty, Charles University Prague, Czech Republic). In 1973 he obtained Ph.D. In his full and rich carrier he had many significant scientific duties: Full Professor of Neuropsychiatry at Medical Faculty of the University of Sarajevo, Vice-Rector of the University of Sarajevo, He was Associate and then Full Member of the Academy of Science and Arts of Bosnia and Herzegovina, obtaining positions of Secretary General and until 2015 as Vice-President. He is Professor Emeritus since 2005 and more than 40 years he is invited speaker on post-graduate study programs in several universities (Sarajevo, Belgrade, Zagreb, Rijeka, Skopje, Florence, Vienna, Rome and Pyongyang). Since 1977 he is Invited Professor at at University of Illinois in Chicago (USA).

He was President of the Yugoslavian Neurology and Psychiatry Society and President of Psychiatric Society of Bosnia and Herzegovina. He is member of the Academy of Science and Arts of Bosnia and Herzegovina, European Academy of Science and Arts (Salzburg, Austria), CINP (College International Neuropsychopharmacologicum) and Honorary Member of the Psychiatric Association of Bosnia-Herzegovina.

He is author or co-author of more than 250 publications in scientific journals, books and monographs, mostly in the domain of clinical psychiatry and he is one of most cited researcher from Bosnia and Herzegovina. He was coordinating more than 50 projects and attended as active participant at numerous congresses, symposia and seminars in the country and abroad.
